This past summer Mount Olivet Day Services discontinued our child care program. With so many changes due to the pandemic, especially with so many parents now working from home, it was best for us to change as well.

This change opened up a wonderful new opportunity to increase the services to our adult day services participants and increase our enrollment for those in our community in need of services. The newly available



space will allow us to provide a dedicated craft room, sensory room, and increase our dining space.

We are enrolling many more participants with memory loss. We plan to use the former child play area to provide an outdoor walking space for our participants to get some fresh air during the summer months while remaining in a safe and secure space. The remodeling project will involve removing walls, adding additional handicap accessible restrooms, new flooring, painting, moving interior doors, and redecorating appropriately for our adult participants.

The estimated cost of this project is approximately \$170,000.

CELEBRATING A CENTENARIAN

On September 12, 2022, Mount Olivet Careview Home resident Elvie Peterson elebrated her 105th birthday! And after 105 years, Elvie still has her sense of humor and appreciation for life.

Elvie was born in Bottineau, North Dakota, in 1917. Her mother was a school teacher, her father a farmer. She had two brothers and two sisters, and rode her horse to school each day—except in the winter when her father took them to school in a sleigh.

Elvie left home at the age of 13, to live in Minot with another family, so she could attend high school. When she graduated from high school, she worked in a tuberculosis sanatorium which she loved! She had her heart set on being a nurse, but her mother vetoed that idea. Elvie went to beauty school—and hated every minute of it.

Her daughter, Sharon Johnson, notes that in her later life she became a home

care health care aide. At last she had found her vocation! And she loved that job.

Elvie worked until she was 94 years old, serving finally as a server at Sam's Club. "She worked her whole life!" Sharon says.

According to her daughter, Elvie was always "feisty and supportive, loving. She's been a great mom!" She took care of her siblings as well.

Elvie has discovered, through a DNA test, that she's 98% Irish. And proud of it!

Elvie, along with her two-year-old daughter Sharon, moved to Minneapolis when Sharon was only two years old because she needed to find work. She got a job at the Varsity Cafe in Dinkytown. Later, when her husband got a job on the Alaska Highway, she and Sharon lived there for a couple years.

At the age of 100 she moved into Mount Olivet Home. "She loved assist-



ed living," Sharon says. Now she lives at Mount Olivet Careview Home. "She's still feisty and aware," Sharon says. "And she loves the people who care for her. Jimmy is her favorite!"
